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Sydney Dance Company and Carriageworks are pleased to announce the Australian dance makers commissioned to create world premiere performances for New Breed 2024, generously supported by The **Balnaves Foundation.** 

Presenting innovative vision and a rich diversity of choreographic ideas, rising dance makers Amber McCartney, Dean Elliott, Piran Scott, and Siobhan McKenna will debut new works, performed by members of Sydney Dance Company, at Carriageworks from 4-14 December 2024, offering a glimpse into the future of Australian dance.

Since its inception in 2014, New Breed, an annual showcase of Australia's most exciting emerging choreography, has provided choreographers with a unique opportunity to collaborate with Sydney Dance Company, Australia's leading voice in contemporary dance. Renowned for its presentation of raw talent and cutting-edge ideas, New Breed is well established as the country's most exciting platform for showcasing new dance work created by some of the country's most gifted emerging choreographers. The initiative celebrated its tenth year in 2023, and has so far showcased 42 world premiere works by emerging Australian dance artists. Alumni include leading contemporary choreographer Melanie Lane, Artistic Director of Australian Dance Theatre, Daniel Riley and internationally acclaimed choreographer Gabrielle Nankivell.

This year's program leads the next wave of future dance choreography, featuring works by Amber McCartney, an award-winning dancer and recipient of the John Truscott Artists Award, Chloe Munro Fellowship, and Green Room Award; Dean Elliott, an acclaimed New Zealand-born dancer currently with Sydney Dance Company who will make his choreographic debut with New Breed; Piran Scott, also with Sydney Dance Company, who has worked with the likes of Alexander Ekman and recognised as Dancer of the Year 2022 by tanz magazine Europe; and Siobhan McKenna, an ATLAS scholarship recipient and multi award winner for previous choreographic work, including Melbourne Fringe Festival's Best Dance Award in 2017.













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Sydney Dance Company Artistic Director Rafael Bonachela said: "Australia is home to a wealth of dynamic emerging dance creators, and their growth relies on the opportunities we provide. New Breed offers these emerging talents a unique platform to explore, experiment, and bring their visions to life on stage. Over the years, this initiative has been pivotal in launching the careers of now-celebrated choreographers who continue to innovate and challenge the norms of contemporary dance. I am delighted to introduce this year's choreographers for New Breed 2024, and can't wait to witness the fresh perspectives they will bring to the stage."

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#### ABOUT AMBER MCCARTNEY

Amber McCartney is a Naarm/Melbourne - based dancer choreographer. Her practice incorporates prosthetics, mask-making, film and practical special effects to create new augmented bodies. Amber has worked extensively with Chunky Move, Lucy Guerin Inc. and is a creative associate of Tasdance. She has collaborated with independent artists such as Jo Lloyd, Jenni Large, Prue Lang, James Batchelor, Antony Hamilton Projects and Stephanie Lake. Amber received the John Truscott Artists Award for her solo Tiny Infinite Deaths, performed in RISING 2023, originally commissioned by Lucy Guerin Inc and The Substation. In 2023 Amber premiered her solo Baby Girl, commissioned by Tasdance, for MONA FOMA. In 2022 she was honoured to receive a Chloe Munro Fellowship from Lucy Guerin Inc. She won a Green Room Award for Best Performer in Prue Lang's Project F and was a finalist for Telstra Emerging Choreographer Award. Her film Tiny Passenger was screened in dance(lens), Dancehouse. In 2020 Amber was a recipient of Chunky Move's Solitude 1 and created her film Softtrap for the 2021 Activators program.

# **ABOUT DEAN ELLIOTT**

Dean Elliott was born in Auckland, New Zealand and began dancing at Norris Studios in Papakura. In 2017 he moved to Sydney to further his dance training at the full - time institution Ev and Bow under the direction of Sarah Boulter and Lisa Bowmer. In 2018, Dean was the recipient of the top prize at the first annual Brisbane International Contemporary Dance Prix which initiated his first engagement with Sydney Dance Company. Dean joined the Theatre of Image in 2019 for their production of Brett and Wendy... a love story bound by art choreographed by Lucas Jervies and directed by Kim Carpenter, in which he danced the role of Young Brett Whiteley. Dean joined Sydney Dance Company in 2019 and has since performed with the Ensemble, touring across Australia and internationally. While in the Company, Dean has worked with and performed the repertoire of a range of choreographers, including Rafael Bonachela, Marina Mascarell, Ohad Naharin, Antony Hamilton, and Melanie Lane. Dean makes his choreographic debut as part of New Breed 2024.











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#### **ABOUT PIRAN SCOTT**

Piran Scott was born in Mackay/Yuwibara, Australia, and trained under Lynette Denny AM at Theatre Arts Mackay. He completed the Professional Year program with the Queensland Ballet, before joining the company as a full member in 2010, under the artistic direction of Francois Klaus. In 2013, Piran received a soloist position with the Leipzig Ballet in Germany, under Mario Schroeder. After Leipzig, Piran was a soloist with the Ballet Theater Basel in Switzerland, directed by Richard Wherlock, followed by successful seasons with the Dance Company St. Gallen under Kinsun Chan, where he was awarded Dancer of the Year 2022 in tanz magazine Europe. Piran has been a professional dancer for over 12 years, performing numerous classical and contemporary works. These include roles with renowned choreographers such as Ohad Naharin, Alexander Ekman, Sharon Eyal, Johan Inger, Ivan Perez, Nils Christie, Thierry Malandain, Natalie Weir, Dimo Milev, Uwe Scholz, Mauro Astolfi, Francesca Frassinelli, Nadav Zelner, Martin Zimmerman, Alba Castillo. Piran joined Sydney Dance Company in 2023, appearing in Rafael Bonachela's critically acclaimed Somos and I Amness alongside Forever & Ever by Antony Hamilton at Sydney Opera House. In 2024, Piran featured in Bonachela's celebrated work momenta. New Breed 2024 is Piran's second choreographic work after the opportunity to create a work for St. Gallen Dance Company's RAW season in 2022.

# **ABOUT SIOBHAN MCKENNA**

Siobhan is a Melbourne/Naarm based choreographer and dancer. She grew up in the Bega Valley in NSW, on Yuin Country before moving to the city where she had the privilege of studying a Bachelor of Fine Arts (dance) at Victorian College of the Arts, graduating in 2016. The journey she has undertaken as an artist over the last seven years includes experience performing in other's work, creating her own work and both teaching and participating in various workshops and residency programs. Her choreographic interests consider relationships between the various materialities of movement, voice, space and rhythm, with a particular focus on exploring the fragility and multiplicity of communication, blurring the lines between meaningful and meaningless and sense and nonsense. Siobhan's choreographic work and practice has been supported by organisations and venues such as Dancehouse, Temperance Hall, Lucy Guerin Inc., The Substation, Dance Massive, Darebin Arts, The Gunpowder Trading Post and Critical Path, Australian Dance Theatre and the Tanja Liedtke Foundation and ImpulsTanz (Vienna). Her choreographic credits include, Rhythmic Fictions (Darebin Arts Speakeasy 2022), Relay (Melbourne Fringe Festival at Temperance Hall 2022), Drama 2,3,4 (Lucy Guerin Inc. in partnership with the Substation 2019) and Utterance (Dancehouse with Dance Massive Festival 2019 and Melbourne Fringe Festival 2017). Both Utterance and Rhythmic Fictions were nominated for Best Choreography in the 2019 and 2022 Green Room Awards and Utterance also received the Melbourne Fringe Festival's 2017 Best Dance Award and Temperance Hall Award. In 2022, Siobhan was incredibly grateful to receive a fellowship from the late Chloe Munro AO and Lucy Guerin Inc alongside other amazing dance artists. This year Siobhan was accepted into the ATLAS scholarship program, with mentor Angélique Willkie at ImpulsTanz where she began the development of a new work. Since 2021 Siobhan has also worked as a teacher and rehearsal director at the Victorian College of the Arts (Melbourne University) and has taught workshops and developed choreographic work with youth companies Yellow Wheel and Fling Physical Theatre.
